The Friends is a nonprofit organization comprised of volunteers whose mission is to increase awareness of the issues of child abuse and neglect, and to raise funding for the Children's Advocacy Center of Brevard, an organization that intervenes in the most severe cases of child abuse and neglect in Brevard County.

Established in 1996, the Children's Advocacy Center of Brevard is a nonprofit organization affiliated with Wuesthoff Health Services. CACB is a multi-agency collaboration of the Child Protection Team, the Florida Department of Children and Families, both of which are onsite at the Advocacy Center; Brevard County Sheriff's Office and municipal law enforcement agencies, the Office of the State Attorney and community mental health professionals. Advocacy Center partners are involved in the most difficult cases in Brevard County, including cases of child sexual or severe physical abuse, and neglect. Major onsite services provided by the Child Protection Team include medical exams, medical consultations, and specialized and forensic interviews. The CACB Clinical Intervention Program provides immediate mental health crisis counseling for child victims and their non-offending family members. All services provided at the Children's Advocacy Center of Brevard are free to the victim's family.
